The Tribal Injury Prevention Resource Center (TIPRC) provides technical assistance and training to all American Indian/Alaska Native tribal and urban communities across the country to promote the implementation of evidence-based best practices in motor vehicle safety.

The long-term goal of TIPRC is to reduce injuries and fatalities associated with motor vehicle crashes throughout Indian Country.



TRIBAL MOTOR VEHICLE **BEST PRACTICES**

Increase awareness of best practices from tribal motor vehicle injury prevention to enhance traffic safety capacity among tribes.



TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE (TA)

Routinely provide nationwide technical assistance on site, and virtually, to tribes and tribal organizations with a focus of proven, evidence-based strategies that can be replicated and tailored in tribal motor vehicle safety programs.



RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT & DISSEMINATION

Develop culturally appropriate small media infographics to raise awareness of motor vehicle safety and serve as a clearinghouse for dissemination of existing resources and tools to support and enhance tribal motor vehicle safety programs.



TRAINING (AVAILABLE UPON REQUEST)

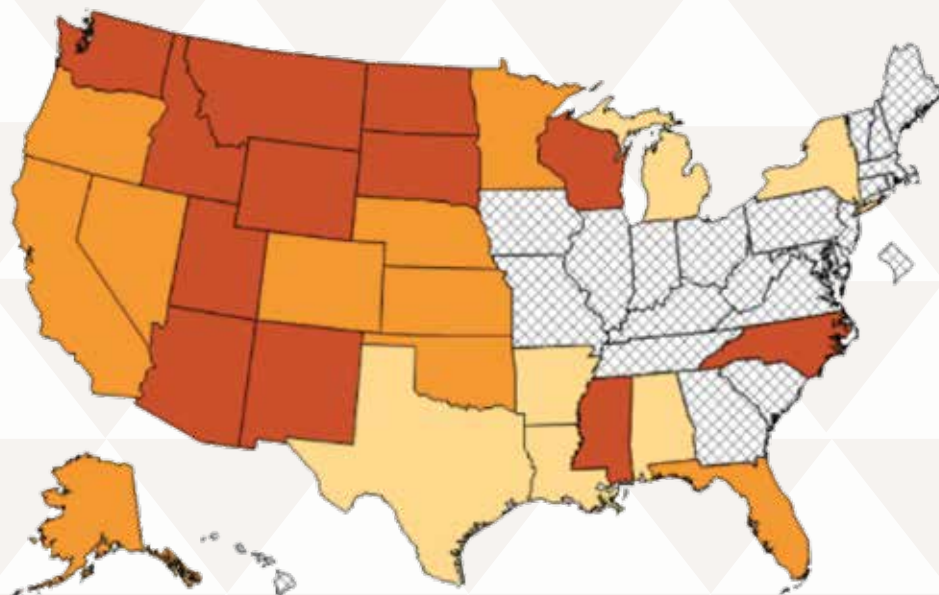
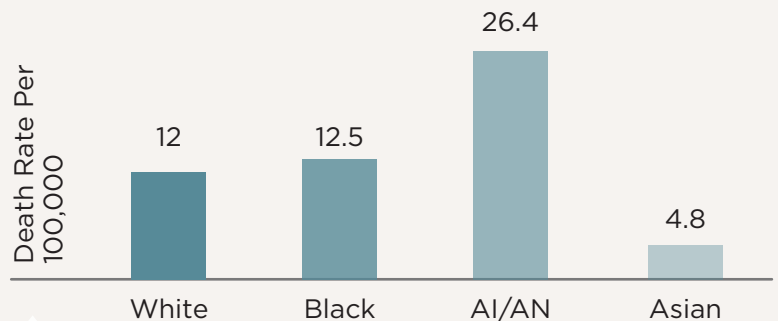
KNOW THE FACTS

UNINTENTIONAL INJURIES ARE THE LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH FOR AMERICAN INDIAN/ALASKA NATIVES (AI/AN) AGES 1 TO 54 AND THE THIRD LEADING CAUSE OF DEATH OVERALL. (2009-2018 SOURCE CDC WISQARS)

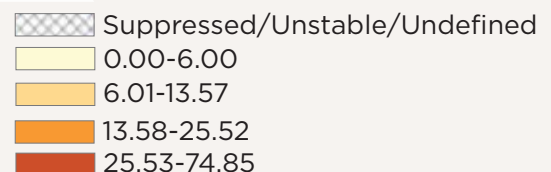

AI/AN experience more motor vehicle injury related deaths compared to any other race and are **2 TIMES MORE LIKELY** to die from a motor vehicle injury compared to Whites.

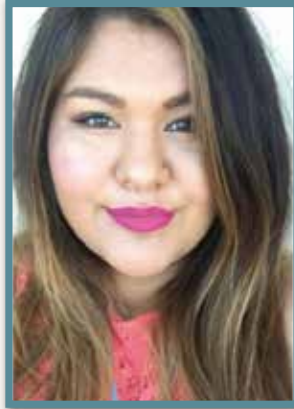

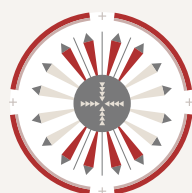
